







First-year student Princess Jefferson '20 was looking for a way to gain experience in education, work with children and the community.

LILAC connected her with the ACLAMO Family Center, a bi-lingual social service agency in nearby Norristown, where Bryn Mawr students provide support and coaching in reading and language comprehension to children in grades K-8.

"I go twice a week—sometimes I just listen to the kids or color with them. We work on their homework, and they help me learn Spanish, which they love. I see this as a first step, giving me on-the-ground skills and preparing me for the career I want."

**ALEXA GJONCA '17 / POLITICAL SCIENCE**

Senior Alexa Gjonca, '17 already knows her post-graduation plans. She's been tackling complex business issues as an analyst in Deloitte Consulting's federal division. An international studies major, Alexa wants to explore how small businesses and private industry can support sustainable and socially conscious development.

Her studies took her to India, Brazil, South Africa, and China to study urban development and ecology. An internship in Sen. Elizabeth Warren's (D-MA) office gave her a taste of working in the public sector, and a motivational LILAC job-and-graduate-school boot camp gave her the skills and desire to start her job search early.

**ALICIA FRANZEN '14 / CHEMISTRY**

Shortly after she began work as an associate scientist at the pharmaceutical company GlaxoSmithKline, chemistry major Alicia Franzen '14 was told she was hired due to all her experience in the lab.

Time spent in the chemistry lab was a hallmark of Franzen's time at Bryn Mawr. She began research with Assistant Chemistry Professor Jason Schmink during her junior year and continued working in his lab throughout the next summer and her senior year.

"Professor Schmink would show us something once and then work alongside of us," she said. "Chemistry is hands-on—you aren't going to learn unless you get to do it."
